

Kopikon I Site Selection

We've narrowed the search for the site of Kopikon I down to seven cities! They are, in alphabetical order:

These cities were determined both based on votes, and based on cost and feasibility considerations. We have below a series of notes about each potential site. All information is from a website with tools for budgeting trips and includes the averages for mid-level travel costs (i.e. not the budget plans or luxury plans). The daily cost estimates assume one of these situations: (1) at least two travelers are sharing a mid-range hotel room, or (2) a single traveler is staying in a budget hotel.


As a note: Based on episode estimates, we will likely be looking at holding Kopikon I around the first week of September 2023! Keep that in mind when making selections.

Note: No matter the location, we will have at least 1 special guest in attendance to make a presentation! Each location may lure others, as well!




